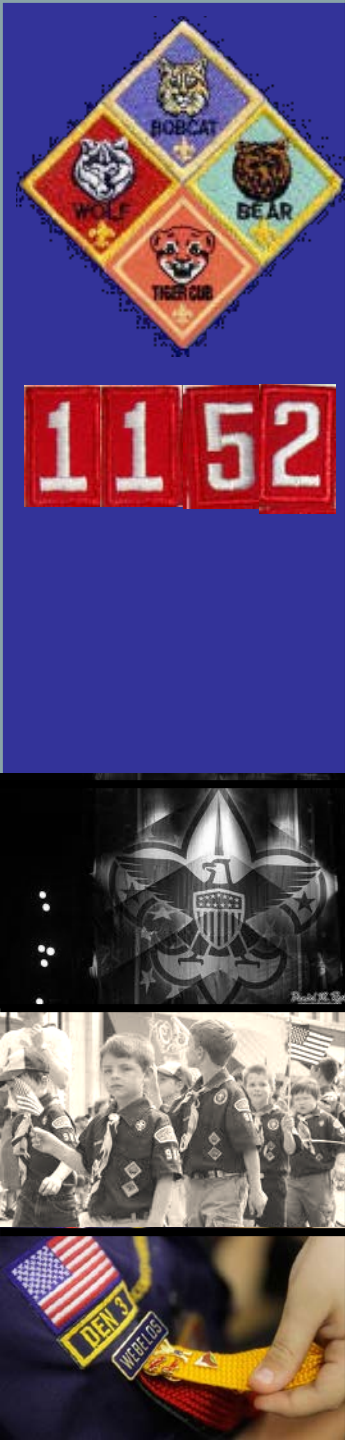

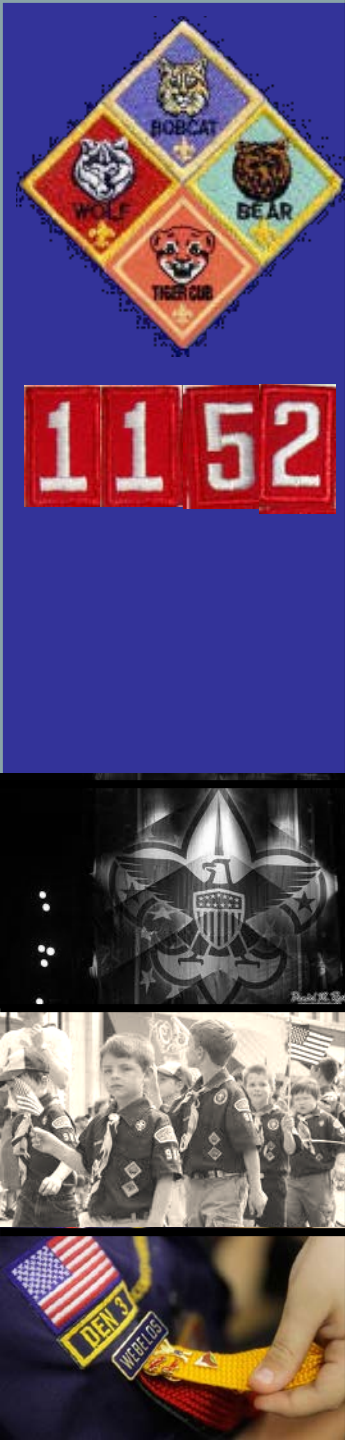
Fun with a Purpose

- Ranks are earned by completing a required set of adventures. Most adventures are done during den meetings or at home.
 - *Lion Program is Parent led introduction*
 - *Tiger Cub, Wolf, Bear follow programs based on Citizenship, Community, Family, Faith, and Self*
- Webelos program focuses on starting the transition to Boy Scouting
 - *Boys earn pins based on activities, become familiar with Boy Scout program, and participate in some Boy Scout activities*



Program Activities

- Pack Meetings (large group)
 - Monthly meeting of all 5 dens (~40 boys) at Lowes Island ES cafeteria
 - Led by Cubmaster, program based core value of month
 - Boys participate in Pack meetings and receive recognition for adventures earned
- Den Meetings (smaller groups)
 - Each den (8-10 boys) meets two or three times a month at Lowes Island cafeteria or an alternate location
 - Some months involve an additional den activity
 - Family activities are done at home
- Parent & Leader Meetings
 - Once-a-month at Lowes Island ES to plan Pack events
- Pack Events (occasional)
 - One monthly activity for the full Pack (all dens)

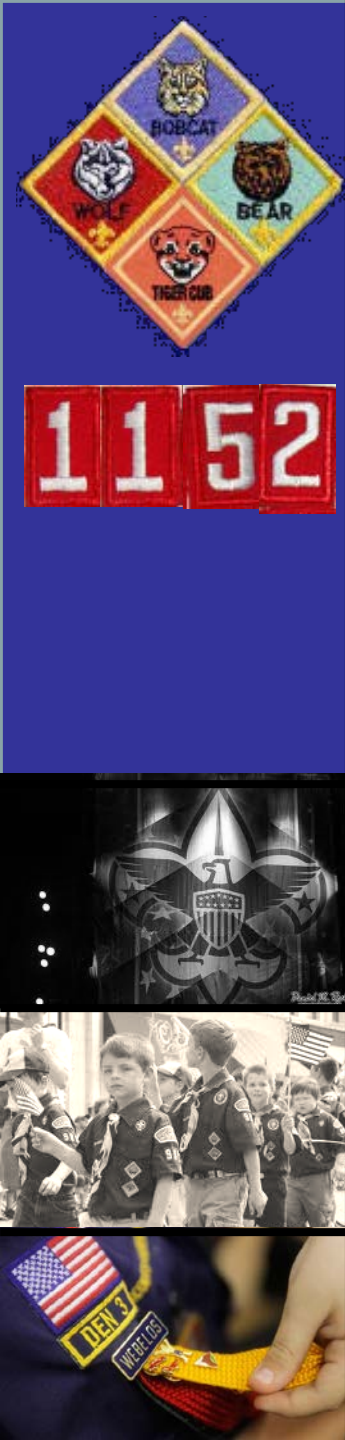

Boy Scouts of America

- The Boy Scouts of America (BSA) is the largest youth organization in the United States
 - More than 2.7 million youth members and 1.1 million registered adult leaders
 - Since our founding in 1910, more than 110 million Americans have been members of the BSA
 - NEW (2017) – Lions program for grade K
 - NEW (2018) – Girls included in Family scouting program

- Boy Scout Division – Boys, Ages 11-18

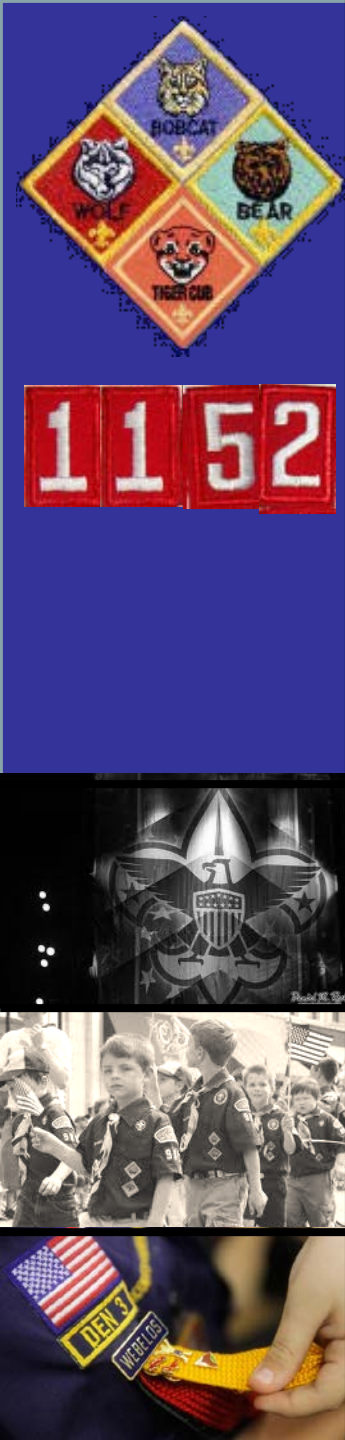
- Venturing Division – Coed, Ages 14-20

- Chartering Organization – ours is Galilee United Methodist Church – John Young is our Chartered Org Rep.



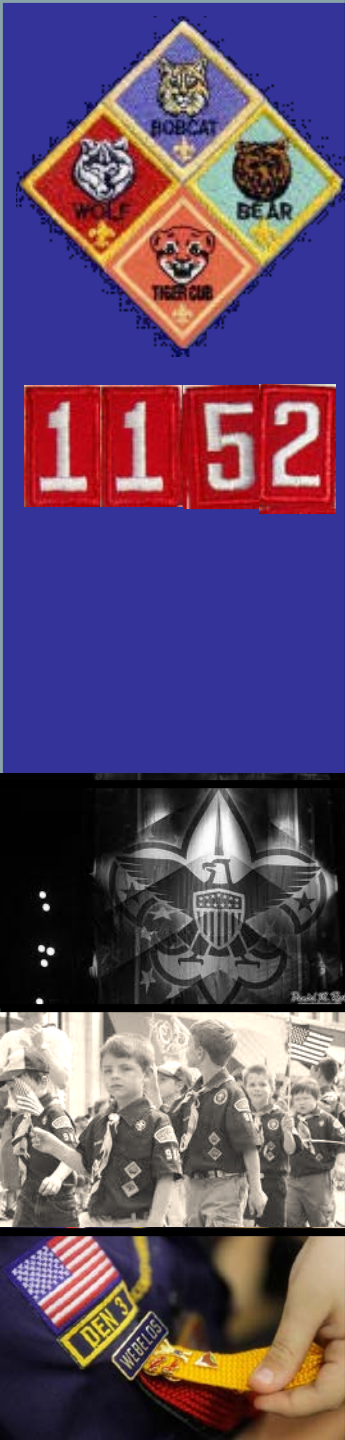
Benefits of Scouting (1 of 2)

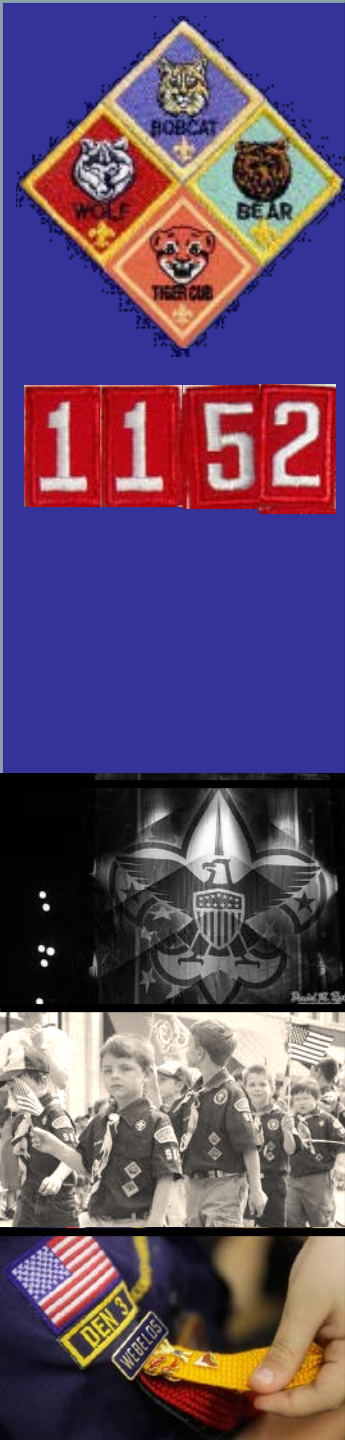

- Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)

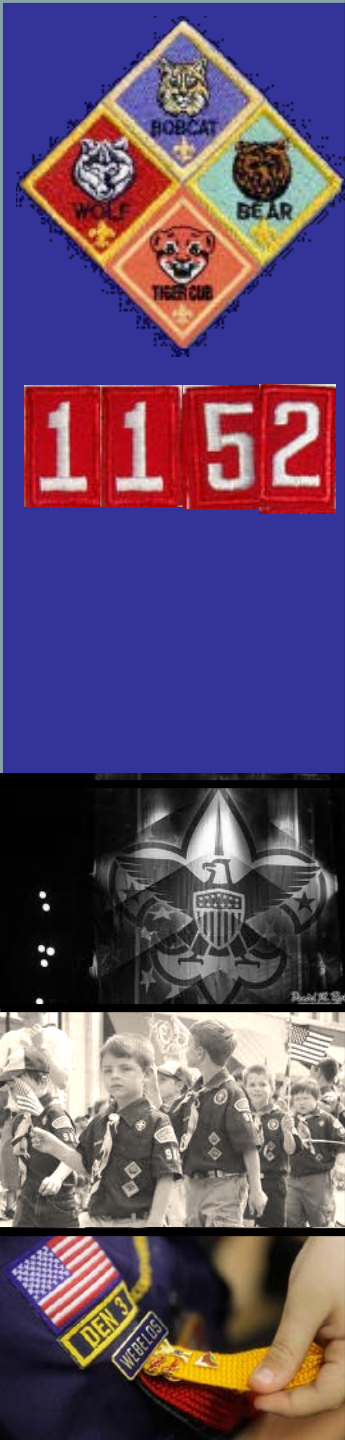


Financial Commitment

- Gives Scouts an opportunity to "earn their own way", and learn life skills.

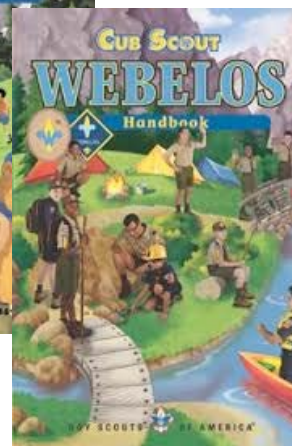
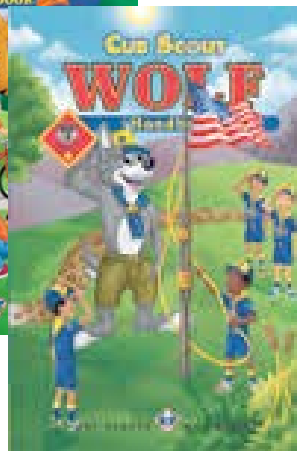

Welcome to Cub Scout Pack 1152 - Potomac Falls, VA



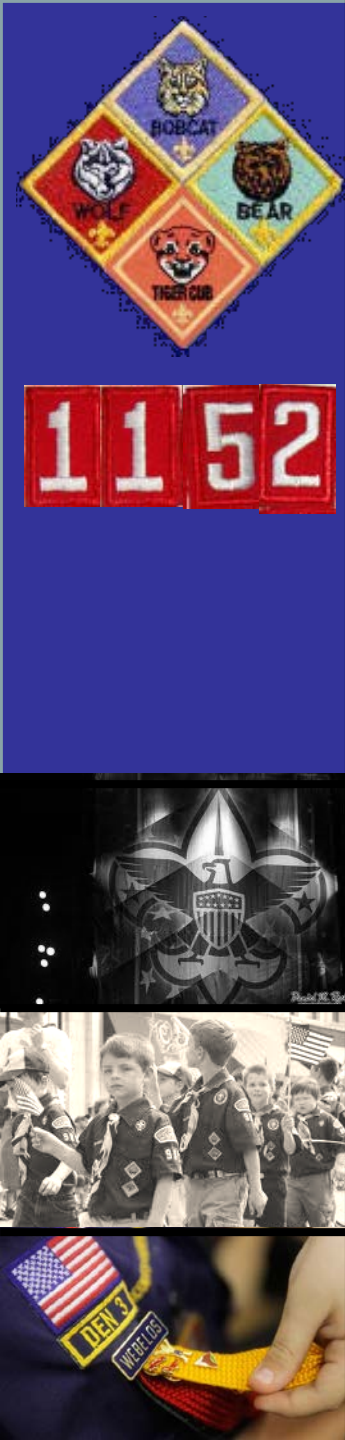
